Inside Meetings

Carry the AA message of recovery to inmates in one of the state or city/county correctional facilities. This is a long-term, usually weekly commitment.

Corrections Prerelease Contact Program

You will first write to a soon-to-be-released inmate, sharing your experience, strength, and hope. Upon their release, you and another AA will take the inmate to some meetings, introduce them to other AAs, and try to help them find a sponsor. This is an occasional commitment lasting about 3 to 6 months with each inmate.

Correspondence Program

Register with GSO, who will assign you to a random inmate - at least 700 miles away - who has requested correspondence with an AA while they are incarcerated. This may be a long-term commitment.

Why It Matters

AA recognizes the special needs of alcoholics in remote communities. For many inmates, these programs are the only contact they have with sober individuals, and due to their incarceration, they are one of the most under-served alcoholic populations.
