

Corrections Committee – 5 August 2025

Chair: Jim H.

Treasurer: Bill O. Beginning balance of \$223.83. Paid \$64.32 for six paperback 12 & 12s. Paid \$30.00 to Central Office for July through December rent. This reduced our balance to \$129.47. Received third quarter disbursement from Intergroup for \$170.62. New balance is \$300.09.

City/County Jail: Connie K. and Nick H. Connie goes into the facility every other Sunday at 2:00 p.m., although she might start going every week. Her meetings take place in Pods B1 and B2. There are usually 2 to 5 inmates in attendance. Nick goes in usually on Saturdays. His meetings take place in L Pod. There are 15 to 20 inmates in attendance. Both report that their meetings are going well.

Community Corrections Center, Lincoln (CCCL): Lee Ann and Joe G. Lee Ann's meeting takes place in the women's section. There are usually 3 to 7 inmates in attendance, but that number is currently up to 8 to 12. Joe reports that the Wednesday night men's meeting continues. One recent meeting had 12 inmates in attendance, but 3 to 4 is the norm.

Reception and Treatment Center (RTC): Bill O. Instead of being separated, Bill and the other volunteer have been going into the same meeting each week. They trade-off who chairs the meeting. There are 10 to 15 inmates in attendance. The facility recently found a case of Big Books that had been missing.

A,A, Corrections Pre-Release Program: Jim H. There are currently 7 men and 4 women signed-up for the program.

Old Business: None.

New Business: Jim presents the committee with a flyer he produced that will try to generate volunteers to take meetings into the jails and prisons in the Lincoln area. The flyer is approved. Jim also will begin sending text reminders to volunteers before each monthly Corrections Committee meeting.

Connie requests 4 paperback 12 & 12s for her meeting at City/County Jail. Motion made and approved. Lee Ann requests 5 hardback Big Books for her meeting at CCCL. Motion made and approved.
